

Strategic Software Selection Checklist for Schools

Use this checklist to ensure that the software you select aligns with both your educational philosophy and community needs.

1. Educational Philosophy Alignment

- Supports Pedagogical Approach: Does the platform enable or reinforce your school's instructional model (e.g., Montessori, project-based learning, flipped classroom)?
- Assessment Philosophy Match: Can it handle assessments, competency-based grading, or traditional exams based on your approach?
- **Student-Centered Design**: Given that you need this, is the user experience tailored for student independence, personalized learning, or guided instruction?
- Curriculum Flexibility: Can the system adapt to custom curricula and evolving educational standards?

2. Community and Stakeholder Needs

- □ **Parent Communication Tools**: Does it offer seamless communication with parents/guardians?
- **Teacher Usability**: Can non-tech-savvy educators operate it with minimal training?
- **Student Inclusivity**: Is it accessible for students with disabilities or those who require alternative learning methods?
- **Community Feedback Integration**: Can stakeholders (parents, staff, students) give feedback through the system?

3. Cultural and Institutional Fit

- School Size Appropriateness: Is it scalable for your current and projected enrollment?
- □ Local Compliance & Language: Does it meet regional regulatory requirements and support local languages?
- Custom Branding: Can the platform reflect your school's identity and values?



4. Operational and Technical Compatibility

- □ Multi-functional Slatform: Does it offer SIS, gradebooks, or HR tools already in use?
- Cloud-Based & Secure: Is data encrypted and hosted reliably?
- □ Mobile Access: Can students and parents use it from phones or tablets?
- Data Portability: Can you export data easily if you switch platforms?

5. Cost and Sustainability

- **Transparent Pricing Model**: Are all costs (setup, support, training) clear and justifiable?
- **Fits Budget Constraints**: Does it align with your school's budget for software and tech?
- Long-Term Viability: Is the vendor stable and likely to be around in a few years?

6. Support and Training

- □ Vendor Training Resources: Is onboarding available for all user types?
- Ongoing Support: Is customer service responsive and knowledgeable?
- **Community and Documentation**: Is there a knowledge base or peer support forum?

7. Evaluation and Decision-Making

- □ Trial Period or Demo: Can you test the platform in a real-world context?
- **Stakeholder Review**: Have you gathered feedback from teachers, IT, parents, and admin staff?
- Defined Evaluation Criteria: Have you ranked features based on *must-haves* vs. *nice-to-haves*?
